May/June 2003

In this review by Stephen Brown, he found the D100 to have accessible controls, fit easily in his hand and produces extraordinary images. Brown stated, "The D100 is Nikon's answer to serious photographers." October 2002

In Christopher Robinson's review of Nikon's D100, he was impressed by its superior image quality and the ability to make prints beyond 11x14 inches, without affecting image quality. He found the camera to be very impressive with command controls that were "thoughtfully placed for on-the-fly adjustments" and he also noted that the camera was loaded with great features and capabilities and offered these at a very competitive price.

PEI Review

September/October 2002

In their review of Nikon's D100, Jeff Kent and Joan Sherwood found this camera to have "impressive autofocus ability" with a very usefultracking feature – ideal for moving subjects. The reviewers liked the light and sturdy feel of the camera, as well as the control layout and grip.
