1. Our Commitment to Privacy

Nikon Americas recognizes that the protection of information that it receives from you is very important. Collecting information allows Nikon Americas to better understand and to be more responsive to you, as well as to develop and maintain websites relevant to your needs, and assists us in managing our business better. To better protect your privacy, we provide this notice explaining our information practices and the choices you can make about the way your information is collected and used.

2. CALIFORNIA & STATE SPECIFIC PRIVACY INFORMATION

IF YOU ARE A CALIFORNIA CONSUMER OR CONSUMER OF ANY OTHER U.S. STATE THAT HAS ENACTED DATA PRIVACY LEGISLATION, YOU MAY HAVE ADDITIONAL RIGHTS REGARDING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

3. The Information We Collect

We collect both Non-Personally Identifiable Information and Personally Identifiable Information, each defined below, that you provide to us through the Communication Points.

"Non-Personally Identifiable Information" is information that, by itself, cannot be used to identify you or to contact you and is information not associated with a specific personal identity. Non-Personally Identifiable Information may include information that you, at your option, voluntarily provide us through any of the Communication Points.

"Personally Identifiable Information" or "Personal Information" is information collected from the Communication Points that is associated with a person's name or personal identity and can be used to identify or contact you. It includes, but is not limited to, such information as your name, postal address, e-mail address, telephone number (mobile and/or landline), fax number, and credit/debit card information. We do not knowingly collect Personally Identifiable Information from individuals under the age of sixteen.

4. How We Use Collected Information

Nikon Americas uses collected information (both Personally Identifiable Information and Non-Personally Identifiable Information) to provide you with the services and/or other information that you request.

For example, we may use Personally Identifiable Information to help you complete a transaction or order with us, or to respond to your inquiries and requests. Personally Identifiable Information in the form of credit/debit card information is used only for payment processing and fraud prevention.

We may use Non-Personally Identifiable Information to improve the experience of all of our Communication Points. In addition, we may take your Personally Identifiable Information and make it Non-Personally Identifiable Information, either by combining it with information about other individuals (aggregating your information with information about other individuals), or by removing characteristics, such as your name, that make the information personally identifiable to you, i.e., de-personalizing your information. Given the nature of this information, there are no restrictions under this Privacy Policy on Nikon Americas' right to aggregate or de-personalize your Personally Identifiable Information, and use and/or share with third parties the resulting Non-Personally Identifiable Information in any way.

5. Who We Share Information With

Nikon Americas may disclose Personally Identifiable Information to companies affiliated with Nikon Americas, such as our parent company and/or unaffiliated third parties performing services on our behalf or for us or with us, such as agents, professional advisors, service providers, consultants, shippers, processors, vendors, and suppliers, for the purposes of enabling them to respond to your requests to us or your purchase of products, services or information, or the other purposes discussed above in Section 4 of this Privacy Policy. All such affiliated and unaffiliated parties who have access to Personally Identifiable Information are required by Nikon Americas to keep confidential such information and may not use, retain, and/or disclose it for any purpose other than to carry out the services they are performing for Nikon Americas and/or as otherwise required or permitted by law. Except as otherwise stated in this Privacy Policy, Nikon Americas will not share Personally Identifiable Information with third parties without your permission, unless to (a) comply with any law, subpoena, regulation or court order; (b) respond to requests from governmental authorities; and/or (c) help prevent fraud or to protect the safety, rights, property or security of Nikon Americas as well as that of third parties.

6. Websites and Targeted Advertising.

Nikon Americas does not maintain a dedicated website and therefore does not collect cookie pixels from your browser and does not participate in targeted advertising.

7. Our Commitment To Information Security

Information security is important at Nikon Americas, and while no security measure is perfect or impenetrable and we cannot guarantee the security of the information that you provide to us, you can be assured that we maintain commercially reasonable physical, electronic, and administrative measures and safeguards and periodically review these security measures and safeguards to protect your Personally Identifiable Information from unauthorized or inappropriate access and use.

8. Our Commitment To Children's Privacy

Our Communication Points are not intended for or directed at individuals under the age of sixteen (16), and we do not knowingly solicit or collect personal information from or about individuals under the age of sixteen. If we learn that we have collected or received personal information from an individual under the age of sixteen (16) without parental consent and verification, we will delete that information. NIKON AMERICAS INC. PRIVACY POLICY CALIFORNIA-SPECIFIC ADDENDUM

If you are a California consumer within the meaning of the California Consumer Privacy Act as amended by the California Privacy Rights Act, as may be amended from time to time (collectively, the "CCPA"), this California Specific Addendum applies to you. This California Specific Addendum supplements our Privacy Policy to which this California Specific Addendum is attached and prevails over any conflicting provisions in the Privacy Policy (this California Specific Addendum and the Privacy Policy, together, the "California Privacy Policy").

Under the CCPA, "Sensitive Personal Information" means (1) personal information that reveals: (a) a consumer's social security, drivers' license, state identification card, or passport number; (b) a consumer's account log-in, financial account, debit card, or credit card number in combination with any required security of access code, password, or credentials allowing access to an account; (c) a consumer's precise geolocation; (d) a consumer's racial or ethnic origin, religious or philosophical beliefs or union membership; (e) the contents of a consumer's mail, email, and text messages unless the business is the intended recipient of the communication; or (f) a consumer's genetic data; and (2) (a) the processing of biometric information for the purpose of uniquely identifying a consumer; (b) personal information collected and analyzed concerning a consumer's health; or (c) personal information collected and analyzed concerning a consumer's sex life or sexual orientation.

To the extent any Sensitive Personal Information is collected, Nikon Americas does not use or disclose your Sensitive Personal Information, as defined above, for any purpose other than those expressly permitted under the CCPA.

Please note Personal Information does not include publicly available information or lawfully obtained, truthful information that is a matter of public concern, de-identified or aggregate consumer information, and personal information protected by certain other sector-specific federal or California statutes. We maintain and use de-identified data without attempting to re-identify such data. For purposes of this section, the term "publicly available" shall have that meaning as defined under the CCPA.

Sources of Collection

For the above categories (A) - (K), we obtain Personal Information from a variety of sources.

These sources include:

- yourself, with respect to both online and offline interactions you may have with us
 or our service providers including but not limited to paper forms and electronic or
 digital forms;
- other entities with whom you transact or with whom you maintain relationships who may deal with us on your behalf;
- the devices you use to access our online services, if any;
- identity verification and fraud prevention services; and
- other sources consistent with this California Privacy Policy.

Our Use of California Personal Information

For the above categories (A) - (K), we use the Personal Information we collect for the business purposes disclosed within this California Privacy Policy.

These business purposes include:

- 1. Audits and reporting relating to particular transactions and interactions, including online interactions, you may have with us or others on our behalf;
- 2. Detecting and protecting against security incidents, and malicious, deceptive, fraudulent or illegal activity, and prosecuting the same;
- 3. Debugging to identify and repair errors in our systems;
- 4. Providing services on our behalf or on behalf of another, including creating, maintaining or servicing accounts; providing customer service and support; fulfilling transactions; verifying identity information; processing payments; and other services;
- 5. To complete a transaction requested by you;
- 6. Conducting activity to verify, enhance, and maintain the quality or safety of services or devices which we may own, control, or provide;
- 7. To respond to your questions and requests;
- 8. To enable us to communicate with you regarding our business relationship, such as for example, by email or by online virtual meeting platforms;
- 9. As part of our recruitment and employment activities including but not limited to conducting interviews and background checks, fulfilling administrative functions (including but not limited to tax, payroll and human resources), providing benefits, and/or other employment-related matters during the course of employment;
- 10. To comply with applicable laws and regulations.

Retention of Personal Information

Nikon Americas keeps your Personal Information as long as reasonably necessary to fulfill the business purpose(s) set forth above, subject to your right to delete Personal Information as further described below in this California Privacy Policy. We may keep some of your Personal Information longer to the extent necessary to comply with any applicable legal or regulatory obligations.

Sharing of Personal Information

A. Disclosure of Personal Information for Business Purposes:

Within the last twelve (12) months, we have disclosed Personal Information identified in the above Categories (A)-(K) for our business purposes, to our service providers, to our affiliates, and/or to any other third party to whom you or your agents have authorized us to disclose your personal information in connection with our business relationship and/or services provided to you. To learn more about the categories of third parties with whom we share such information, please see Section 5 of the Privacy Policy.

B. Sale of California Personal Information

Within the last twelve (12) months, we have not sold any Personal Information identified in categories (A)-(K) above as a "sale" defined under the CCPA, subject to Section C below. We do not disclose Personal Information of individuals we know to be under the age of sixteen (16) to third parties for monetary or other valuable consideration as a "sale" under the CCPA without affirmative authorization. If you are an individual under the age of sixteen (16), please do not submit any Personal Information to us unless we have received the affirmative authorization described below in this California Specific Addendum.

C. Targeted Advertising. Nikon Americas does not maintain a dedicated website and therefore does not collect cookie pixels from your browser and does not participate in online behavioral or targeted advertising.

California Rights and Choices

You have certain rights related to your Personal Information. You may exercise these rights free of charge except as otherwise provided by applicable law. We endeavor to respond to your request promptly upon verification and as required by applicable law.

- **A. Right to Know/Access.** You have the right to request that we disclose to you:
 - o the categories of Personal Information we have collected about you;
 - o the categories of sources from which the Personal Information is collected;
 - o our business or commercial purpose for collecting, selling or sharing Personal Information;

- the categories of third parties with whom we disclose Personal Information;
 and
- the specific pieces of information we have collected about you. To protect your privacy and security, we may redact this information to the extent it is Sensitive Personal Information.

To the extent that we sell or share your Personal Information or disclose such information for a business purpose, you may request that we disclose to you:

- o the categories of Personal Information that we have collected about you;
- o the categories of Personal Information about you that we have sold or share within the meaning of the CCPA and the categories of third parties to whom the Personal Information was sold or shared, by category or categories of personal information for each third party to whom the California personal information was sold or shared; and
- o the categories of Personal Information about you that we disclosed for a business purpose.

To the extent reasonably feasible, Nikon Americas will provide you with the information requested in a portable format.

- **B. Right to Delete.** You have the right to request that we delete Personal Information about you which we have collected from you. We may deny your deletion request if retaining the information is necessary for us or our service provider(s) to:
 - o complete the transaction for which we collected the personal information, provide a good or service that you requested, take actions reasonably anticipated within the context of our ongoing business relationship with you, or otherwise perform our contract with you.
 - o detect security incidents, protect against malicious, deceptive, fraudulent, or illegal activity, or prosecute those responsible for such activities.
 - o debug products to identify and repair errors that impair existing intended functionality.
 - o exercise free speech, ensure the right of another consumer to exercise their free speech rights, or exercise another right provided for by law.
 - o comply with the California Electronic Communications Privacy Act (Cal. Penal Code § 1546 et. seq.).
 - engage in public or peer-reviewed scientific, historical, or statistical research in the public interest that adheres to all other applicable ethics and privacy laws, when the information's deletion may likely render impossible or seriously impair the research's achievement, if you previously provided informed consent.
 - o enable solely internal uses that are reasonably aligned with consumer expectations based on your relationship with us.
 - o comply with a legal obligation.
 - o make other internal and lawful uses of that information that are compatible with the context in which you provided it.

- **C. Right to Correct.** You have the right to correct your inaccurate Personal Information that we maintain about you.
- **D. Right to Opt-Out.** You have the right to opt-out of the sale or sharing of your Personal Information by Nikon Americas.
- E. Right to Limit Use/Disclosure of Sensitive Personal Information. You have the right to limit the use or disclosure of your Sensitive Personal Information by Nikon Americas. To the extent any Sensitive Personal Information is collected, Nikon Americas does not use or disclose your Sensitive Personal Information for any purpose other than those expressly permitted under the CCPA.
- **F. Right to Non-Discrimination.** You have the right not to receive discriminatory treatment by Nikon Americas for the exercise of your privacy rights conferred by the CCPA, including an employee's, applicant's, or independent contractor's right not to be retaliated against for the exercise of their CCPA rights.
- **G.** How to Submit a Request. You may request to exercise these rights by:
 - Completing Rights Request Form available by clicking here.
 - o Calling us toll-free at **877-589-0493**.
- **H.** Verifiable Request. As required under applicable law, we take steps to verify your identity before granting you access to information or acting on your request to exercise your rights. We may require you to provide information sufficient to allow us to reasonably verify you are the person about whom we collected personal information and to describe your request with sufficient detail that allows us to properly understand, evaluate, and respond to it. For example, we may request that you provide us with at least two data points that match those that we maintain about you; or, for Sensitive Personal Information, we may require that we match three pieces of personal information you provide to us with personal information we maintain about you, together with obtaining a signed declaration from you confirming that you are the consumer whose personal information is the subject of the request. We may deny a request or limit our response to your exercise of the above rights as permitted under applicable law. We will respond to your request no later than forty-five (45) calendar days after we receive your request, provided that any delays in providing verification information may delay our processing of your request.
- **I. Agent Authorization and Disability Access.** You may designate an authorized agent to make a request on your behalf. You may make such a designation by providing the agent with written permission to act on your behalf. As permitted by law, we may require additional verification in response to a request even if you choose to use an agent. Unless the agent provides us with a valid Power of Attorney,

we may require a consumer to verify their identity with us separately. You may also make a verifiable consumer request on behalf of your minor child.

Consumers with disabilities may access this California Privacy Policy in an alternative format by contacting us in writing at Nikon Americas Inc., 1300 Walt Whitman Road, Melville, New York 11747, Attention: Legal Department - Privacy, and requesting that we mail a copy of this California Privacy Policy.

- J. Children's Right to Opt Out and Right to Opt In. Although we are not currently selling Personal Information, if you are sixteen (16) years of age or older, you have the right to direct us to not sell your Personal Information at any time should our practices change in the future (the "right to opt out") and this election shall be effective for a period of twelve (12) months. We do not sell the Personal Information of consumers we actually know are younger than sixteen (16) years of age, unless we receive affirmative authorization (the "right to opt in") from either the consumer who is between thirteen (13) and sixteen (16) years of age, or the parent or guardian of a consumer younger than thirteen (13) years of age. Consumers who opt-in to Personal Information sales may opt-out of future sales at any time.

Nondiscrimination and Financial Incentives

We will not discriminate against you because of your exercise of any of the above rights, or any other rights under the CCPA, including by:

- o denying you goods or services;
- o charging different prices or rates for goods or services, including through the use of discounts or other benefits or imposing penalties;
- o providing you a different level or quality of goods or services; or
- suggesting that you will receive a different price or rate for goods or services or a different level or quality of goods or services.

Nikon Americas does not currently offer any "financial incentives" under the CCPA that can result in different prices, rates, or quality levels. Any CCPA-permitted financial incentive we offer will reasonably relate to your personal information's value and contain written terms that describe the program's material aspects. Participation in a financial incentive program requires your prior opt in consent, which you may revoke at any time.

Other California Privacy Rights

Under California's "Shine the Light" law (Civil Code Section § 1798.83), if you are a California resident, you may, one time per calendar year, request a notice regarding the categories of personally identifiable information disclosed by Nikon Americas (if any) during the immediately preceding twelve (12)-month period to third parties for their own direct marketing purposes, and the name and address of any such third parties. Sources of Collection

Sharing of Personal Information

A. Disclosure of Personal Information for Business Purposes

Within the last twelve (12) months, we have disclosed Personal Information identified in the above Categories (A)-(K) for our business purposes, to our service providers; to our affiliates; and/or to any other third party to whom you or your agents have authorized us to disclose your personal information in connection with our business relationship and/or services provided to you. B. Sale of Personal Information

- G. Verifiable Request. As required under applicable law, we take steps to verify your identity before granting you access to information or acting on your request to exercise your rights. We may require you to provide information sufficient to allow us to reasonably verify you are the person about whom we collected personal information and to describe your request with sufficient detail that allows us to properly understand, evaluate, and respond to it. For example, we may request that you provide us with at least two data points that match those that we maintain about you; or, for Sensitive Data, we may require that we match three pieces of personal information you provide to us with personal information we maintain about you, together with obtaining a signed declaration from you confirming that you are the consumer whose personal information is the subject of the request. We may deny a request or limit our response to your exercise of the above rights as permitted under applicable law. We will respond to your request no later than forty-five (45) calendar days after we receive your request, provided that any delays in providing verification information may delay our processing of your request.
- **H. Appeal Process.** In the event we deny your request to your exercise of the above rights, then to the extent applicable under the State Privacy Laws, you have the right to appeal such denial within a reasonable time after your receipt of the notice sent by us informing you of our denial. Instructions on how to appeal will be included with the notice of denial.
- I. Agent Authorization and Disability Access. You may designate an authorized agent to make a request on your behalf. You may make such a designation by providing the agent with written permission to act on your behalf. As permitted by law, we may require additional verification in response to a request even if you choose to use an agent. Unless the agent provides us with a valid Power of Attorney, we may require a consumer to verify their identity with us separately. You may also make a verifiable consumer request on behalf of your minor child.
